#### **City Council Meeting Minutes** October 18, 2016 - 7:00 PM, City Hall Call to Order & Roll Call:

- Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Tad Miller, Holly Lovik-Hanna, Nick Bailey, Cindy Peters, and Ron Rachut; Maintenance Manager Steve Roberts. Wendy Lunning absent. Guest attending: Dave & Lola Bruns
- Nick motioned, Holly 2nd to approve the minutes of the September. Unanimous
- Ron motioned, Tad 2nd to accept agenda. Unanimous. Agendas are posted at City Hall, at the Library, and at the Post Office, 24 hours in advance of each Council Meeting. If you wish to be on the Agenda, please contact City Hall two days before the meeting.

#### Jake Jackson Dealership:

Jake Jackson introduced Toni Gonnerman as owner of potential Car Dealership located at the former gas station at corner of Main and First Street. A maximum of 14 cars would be on the lot. The dealership is estimating to open by the end of this calendar year.

#### **Eddie May Financials:**

- Eddie present to explain the allocation of administrative funds and how this affects the financials.
- Advantage Business Solutions is no longer offering online backup service. Carbonite was offered as an alternative and they help to set this up on the computers.
- CD has been reinvested in the amount of \$30,388.10 @ 1.42% APR for 60 months.

#### City Maintenance Report:

- Steve stated that the lagoon typically processes 50,000 gallons per month, but the last serveral months it has been over 250,000 per month due to the excessive rain Fertile has had. He has documented all of this information for the DNR and State reports.
- Visu-Sewer inspected the sewer lines on West Main and are currently waiting for results.
- The park has been cleaned of debris from the recent flooding.
- The valve on the well pump has been replaced and pump cleaned.
- Steve has been painting new parking lines on the street and curbs.

#### Mayor's Report

- 2016 Building Permits were sent to the County Assessor's Office.
- Assigned E911 number to building West of Larson's Plumbing and Heating. Building was assigned number 108 West Main.
- WCDA board approved proposal for Downtown Café. Proposal has been sent to their attorney for final approval. Funds are segregated as "Special Interest Funds" to help develop the economy in Worth County.
- Property owners have been notified of vehicle violations Joyce has given information to John Greve's, city attorney, for follow up.

- Certified letters sent to three residences in regards to junk vehicle and dense growth of weeds.
- Property owners of the USPS have been notified of updated needed. The owners are working with contractors to get the building repaired.
- Joyce presented and ordinance amendment for Main Street parking based on the recommendation of John Greve's, city attorney. Public Hearing will be held in November for review.
- Joyce has ordered 3 more snow ordinance signs for Main Street. It is the property owner's responsibility to remove snow and ice from adjoining sidewalks.

### OLDEST RESIDENT WILL BE FERTILE'S 'QUEEN OF THE DAY'

#### Published in the Forest City Summit, July 30, 1981



Mrs. Ethel Deuel will reign as "Queen of the Day" during Fertile's 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary celebration. At 97 years old, Ethel is the oldest resident and has lived in town 89 years.

Ethel was born in 1883 in Lodi, Wis., to Edwin and Mehetabel Brown. Her family came to Iowa by train Sept. 20, 1989, on her sixth birthday and lived on a farm near Clear Lake. In 1892 the family moved to Fertile.

Ethel's father enjoyed poetry and was editor of the Fertile Enterprise for several years in addition to operating a butcher shop. The Brown family lived in the rooms above the meat market. When the telephone system was installed in town, Ethel's mother operated the switchboard in a side room of the meat market with Ethel and her sister helping as telephone operators. When the family built a house, the switchboard moved to a small building on their lot. Ethel's mother continued to operate it for twenty-five years.

As a young girl Ethel attended country school. She remembers the evening singing classes when everyone would pile in the sled and take the team of horses to the school. A teacher from Mason City would come and teach

parents and students about the basics of music and they would sing songs.

For entertainment, parties would be held in homes. The people would gather around while Ethel's husband played the mouth organ and they would sing and play games for the evening.

Ethel was active in the Fertile Church of Christ and remembers the annual summer picnic. All families would travel in horse drawn wagons to Clear Lake, take a boat across the lake and enjoy a picnic. Another fun church activity was the hay rack ride. Families would join on a hay rack while a team or horses took them for a ride. Ethel was a member of the first class to graduate from the Fertile eighth grade in 1901. She attended 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grades in Mason City, and then taught country school for 1½ years until she was married.

She was married to Wallace Deuel, son of Ira and Helen Deuel, in 1907. Wallace worked at the brick plant for a time then owned and operated a garage where Larson Plumbing and Heating now stands. Later he farmed until 1933 when he worked with the Worth county road maintenance. He passed away in 1943.

Deuel's have two children, Ira, who passed away in 1978, and Vera (Mrs. Roger Humphrey) now living in Fertile. (Both have now passed away.) Ethel has three grandchildren of which one is Richard Humphrey.

#### **COUNTY SCHOOL**

My first years of school were at a country school. It was a small one-room building with two outdoor toilets in the back. One building was designated "Boys" the other "Girls". In complete charge was one teacher (always a lady)and usually eight to ten students depending on the size of the families. The grades included first through eighth and sometimes only one or none to a grade. The children always walked to school.

Our farm was about one and one-half miles from the school following the road or half the distance across the fields. I was only five the first year my two older sisters looked after me and probably would carry me part of the way if I whined enough.

One day in the late fall, a sudden blizzard struck. There was no radio or telephone at the school, so there was no advance warning whatsoever. The fierce snow and wind made visibility only about 50 feet. The temperature was also rapidly toward zero. The teacher was only about 20 years old and did not know what to do. It was very apparent to her that she could not send the children out in the storm to go home. We children thought it great fun and ran from window to window watching the snow pile into huge drifts.

At that time a big wagon pulled by two farm horses appeared out of the storm. It was my father! He had come to see everyone safely home! Quickly, he banked the fire in the potbellied wood stove and locked the schoolhouse door. Then he loaded everyone on the wagon. The children were always warmly dressed, but the teacher always wore a dress and light stockings. My father brought a blanket to wrap around her and there was loose straw in the wagon box for the children to huddle in. The sides of the wagon protected us from the icy wind.

When the teacher and neighbor children had been delivered safely to their homes, the snow was blowing so bad my father could no longer see to drive! He loosened the reins on the horses and told them to take us home. Then he got down in the straw with us children and tried to stay warm.

Our two horses, Florry and Bess wanted nothing better than to return to their warm stall with plenty of hay. After a bit, we raised up and peered out. Sure enough, we were pulling up the long driveway to our house! Our father stopped in front of the house and let us off and then took the horses to the barn. We ran into the house and told our mother what fun we had had. The next day the storm had passed and school was held as usual.







## Grandma's Old-Fashioned Bread Pudding with Vanilla Sauce

4 cups (8 slices) cubed white bread

1/2 cup raisins

2 cups milk

1/4 cup butter

1/2 cup sugar

2 eggs, slightly beaten

1 tablespoon vanilla

1/2 teaspoon ground nutmeg

#### Sauce Ingredients:

1/2 cup butter

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 cup heavy whipping cream

1 tablespoon vanilla

#### Pudding

Heat oven to 350°F.

Combine bread and raisins in large bowl.
Combine milk and 1/4 cup butter in 1-quart saucepan. Cook over medium heat until butter is melted (4 to 7 minutes). Pour milk mixture over bread; let stand 10 minutes.

Stir in all remaining pudding ingredients. Pour into greased 1 1/2-quart casserole.

Bake for 40 to 50 minutes or until set in center.


#### Sauce:

Combine all sauce ingredients except vanilla in 1quart saucepan. Cook over medium heat, stirring occasionally, until mixture thickens and comes to a full boil (5 to 8 minutes).

Take off the heat and stir in vanilla.

To serve, spoon warm pudding into individual dessert dishes; serve with sauce. Store refrigerated 1/2 cup firmly packed brown sugar


