

THE PRICE OF OUR FREEDOM

Have you ever wondered what happened to those who signed the Declaration of Independence?

Five signers were captured by the British as traitors and tortured. None of them died while a prisoner and four were taken into custody, not because they were considered "traitors" due to their status as signatories to the document, but were prisoners of war.

Twelve had their homes ransacked and burned.

Abraham Clark of New Jersey saw two of his sons captured. John Witherspoon, NJ saw his eldest son killed in battle in the Battle of Germantown in October on 1777.

Nine of the signers died during the course of the Revolutionary War, but none died from wounds or hardships inflicted on them.

What kind of men were they?

Twenty four were lawyers and jurists, eleven were merchants, nine were farmers and large plantation owners, men of means, well educated, but they signed the Declaration of Independence knowing full well that the penalty would be death if they were captured.

They signed and they pledged their lives, their fortunes and their sacred honor.

Carter Braxton of Virginia, a wealthy planter and trader, saw his ships swept from the seas by the British Navy. He sold his home and properties to pay his debts and he died in rags.

Vandals or soldiers or both located the properties of Ellery, Clymer, Hall, Walton, Gwinnett, Heyward, Rutledge and Middleton. At the battle of Yorktown, Tomas Nelson Jr. noted that the British General Cornwallis had taken over the Nelson home for his headquarters. The owner quietly urged General George Washington to open fire. The home was destroyed and Nelson died bankrupt.

Francis Lewis had his home and property destroyed. The enemy jailed his wife and she died a few years later.

John Hart was driven from his home where his wife had died a few months earlier. Their thirteen children of whom many had already left home, fled for their lives. His grist mill was laid to waste. For more than a year he lived in forests and caves returning home after the war his children vanished.

Norris Livingston suffered a similar fate. Such were the stories and sacrifices of the American Revolution. These were not wild and rubble rousing ruffians, they were soft spoken men of means and education. They had security but they valued liberty more. Standing tall and straight and unwavering, they pledged; "the support of this declaration, with a fierce reliance on the protection of the Divine Providence, we mutually pledge to each other, our fortunes and sacred honor."

They gave you and me a free and independent America. The history books never told you a lot about what happened in the Revolutionary War. We didn't just fight the British. We were British subjects at the time and we fought our own government.

Some of us take these liberties so much for granted, but we shouldn't.

So, take a few minutes while enjoying your 4th of July holiday and silently thank these patriots and the men and women who have defended our country. It's not much to ask for the price they paid.

Remember: Freedom is never free!!





Fertile Park

Although Fertile is a small town (also known as Putsy), it has one of the nicest parks I know of. Called the William Rhodes Island Park, this park dates back to 1886. The Fertile Park offers much to the senses.

The Fertile Park has quite a bit for people to see. As a person crosses the flat cement road bridge the first thing that catches his or her eyes is the peaceful stream of water. To the right is an antiquated brick circular structure with a cement top that may have been used as a band shelter at one time. Close by is a miniature log cabin the park people keep their tools in. There is a playground with a grey metal swing set, and animal hopping swings; one's a rabbit and the other is a fox. There are also horse shoe pits covered over with what looks like white little houses, probably to protect the pits from the weather and keep the clay moist. Right before getting to the center of the park, there is an old well that has the words "Red Jacket" written on it. A memorial stands next to the well. It is made of brick, and the date says 1956. There are seven names to the left and eight names to the right. It may be of the people lost to the war that lived in Fertile. Next to the memorial is a walking bridge with guard rails. One can see the Winnebago River with the waves rushing along, and at each end of the bridge there are benches where people can sit and watch the river flow downstream. There are also red and white flowers planted at each end of the bridge. The plants are cared for by the Fertile Garden Club. Across from the bridge, one of the shelter houses has a wood burning fireplace close by and one of the old time grills people can cook their burgers on. Looking to the west, there is a basketball/tennis court that has rough and worn concrete, but it works for people who are into sports. A little further down the river bank stands the original grindstone used to sharpen tools for building the old mill and dam. Further west is where a person can see the dam and old mill right across the river. People love to fish by the dam. There is a grass path by the dam that leads toward the south and east. Over on the west side, the second shelter house sits with a rustic old fashioned merrygo-round, and close by are the newer style outhouses. Then there is a circular gravel lane that can be used to leave the park or go round again.

The sounds of the park are pleasant ones, and there are many of them. 


