

FERTILE — Viola Roberts, 100, knew the answer to her own question as she picked up a faded photo of herself and other volunteers standing outside the former Fertile Church of Christ many years ago. The building was replaced in the late 1970s. Many of the people are now gone as well. Dutifully, Roberts scanned the faces. "I think I'm the only one living out of that bunch," she said, in a manner-of-fact tone.

She shrugged and smiled. At 100 years old, it happens.

It's not surprising Roberts is in the church archives. Or, at least to those who know her,

that Roberts and another centenarian, 101-year-old Virgil Ouverson, are still active members of the Fertile Church of

They still show up religiously for Sunday services at the Worth County church. Ouverson drives from his house on the west side of town, she from the east. Neither misses adult Bible school on Sundays.

The congregation will honor that dedication at a reception June 7 at the church.

"The one word that comes to mind, I think anybody would say with Virgil and Viola, is the word faithfulness," said Fertile Church of Christ Pastor Rob Perry.

"There's just no doubt about it. They're just the epitome of what faithfulness is all about, not just with what we believe but in their commitment to being here and being part of what the church is about," Perry said.

Even now, after a century, Ouverson and Roberts use the church as the foundation of their lives.

"It's a wonderful church. Wonderful people. This is home," Roberts said while chatting over coffee Monday at the church. "I mean, if I was to leave this church I would be lost."

"Same way with me," Ouverson said. "I wouldn't know where to go."

A former church deacon, Ouverson used to fire up the stove before farm work each morning so the congregation members would have heat when they arrived. He's likely to be found at the church whenever the doors are open, said Perry. In addition to the scriptural guidance, the congregation itself has helped Ouverson and Roberts age gracefully.

They're both still very independent. Each still drives a car. Ouverson does his own yard work and house chores.

"The people are just wonderful, especially after we've gotten older," Roberts said. "They just do everything for me.

Whatever I need, I can always depend that I'm going to get help."

The June 7 reception will feature several of Ouverson's latch-hook creations. He began doing the textiles, which are made from pulling loops of yarn through a pattern, about 10 years ago to keep himself busy during the winter. One of a picture of Jesus hangs in the church.

It started when I turned about 90," he said of the hobby. "Nothing else to do. Wasn't able to work outside, so I went to

Roberts loves to cook. Although she isn't up to preparing the big family meals of years past, she still loves to bake and still

Refusing to quit doing things she loves, even if it must be modified, has helped Roberts live a long and fulfilling life. "Don't sit around and think, 'well, I'm too old to do that," she said. "Just get up and do it and forget about your age. Just get up and do what you want to do." Ouverson agrees.

"Make up your mind to do it. If you think you can't do it, don't even start," he said. "You're lost or done before you start

RICE SALAD

Janice Abram's recipe from Fertile Cookbook 1981

3 c. cold water

½ t. salt

½ c. rice

1 (3 oz.) pkg. strawberry Jello

½ c. sugar

1 (10 oz.) box strawberries

½ carton Cool Whip

Place water and salt with rice in saucepan over high heat. Heat until steaming. Reduce heat and cook for 20 to 25 minutes or until tender, stirring often. Remove from heat and add Jello, stir well. Add sugar and strawberries and mix. Chill until not quite set. Add Cool Whip and chill.

Strawberry Salad

Lois Anderson's from Fertile cookbook 1981

1 can crushed pineapple

1 carton cottage cheese

2 pkg. wild strawberry Jello

1 large Cool Whip

Bring pineapple, juice included, to a boil. Add wild strawberry Jello. Cool. When cool but not set add 1 carton cottage cheese and 1 carton Cool Whip.






