



The Iowa 4-H Hall of Fame was established in 2002 to help commemorate the 100th anniversary of 4-H.



2 large cooking apples, peeled, cored and thinly sliced (about 2 1/3 c.)

1 box yellow cake mix

1 ¼ c, water, 1/3 c. vegetable oil

3 eggs, ¼ t. apple pie spice

TOPPING

2/3 c Whipped fluffy white frosting

½ cup cool whip

Caramel topping

Heat oven to 350. In heavy saucepan, cook butter, whipping cream and brown sugar over low heat, stirring occasionally, just until butter is melted. Pour into 13x9 inch cake pan. Sprinkle with pecans, top with sliced apples.

Mix cake mix, water, oil, eggs and apple pie spice as directed on cake mix. Carefully spoon batter over apple mixture.

Bake 41 to 47 min. or test with toothpick. Cool in pan 10 minutes. Loosen sides of cake from pan. This is like an upside down cake, turn pan over on a platter and remove cake. Let pan remain over cake about a minute so caramel can drizzle over cake. In a small bowl, mix frosting and whipped topping. Serve warm cake topped with frosting mixture and drizzled caramel topping. Store in refrigerator.




