

COOK'S CORNER

It is summer and "picnic time" when you eat potato salad and baked beans, watermelon and all that good food. Picnic foods are usually made in larger quantities, so that these recipes feed more people. Enjoy!

POTATO SALAD (From Low's Family Feast)

4 lbs. potatoes (cooked and diced) 6 tsp. mustard

3 C. Miracle Whip

¾ tsp. salt

3 T. sugar

1/2 onion

5 tsp. vinegar

9 hardboiled eggs (diced)

Mix all together and chill overnight for best flavor.

BAKED BEANS (from scratch)

1 lb. dried navy or northern beans 1 onion

¼ tsp. baking soda

1 tsp. dry mustard

1 cup white sugar

1 tsp. salt

½ c. dark corn syrup

1/4 lb. salt pork or bacon

Cover beans with water and ¼ tsp baking soda.

Bring to a boil. Drain and wash well. Add new water. Add rest of ingredients. Bake at 350 degrees until done.

17 oz. pkg. Macaroni

3 stalks cut up celery

1 can diced carrots

1 med. Onion, diced

1 can peas

1 can kidney beans

1 can French green beans

1 cup cream

1 sm. Jar pimentos

1 pint (2 cups) salad dressing



FERTILE MILL

Rhodes Mill (also known as the Fertile Mill) was built in 1858 by William Rhodes. The mill was built on Lime Creek, now known as the Winnebago River. The "History of Mitchell and Worth Counties," published in 1918 described the mill as being "34 by 42 feet in dimensions, two and one-third stories high, had three runs of stone, and a capacity to turning out 50 barrels of first class flour per diem." It is further stated in the book, "Lime Creek Rhodes Mill at Fertile has a fall of 11 feet and develops 70 horse power." The mill operated into the 1930s. The building was restored in 1971. The building has rooms for guest accommodations. The building is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.


