COUNCIL MEETING

The regular meeting of the Fertile Town Council was held at the Fertile Library on Tuesday, May 3, at 7:30 P. M., with Mayor Worsley presiding. Present were Councilmen Miller, Morse, Berg, and Tuttle; absent, Humphrey.

Minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Clerk's report read and approved. Motion by Berg to publish proposed ammended budget in the Northwood Anchor and to have public meeting June 7. Miller seconded. All Ayes.

Motion by Morse to approve Street construction report. Tuttle seconded. All Ayes.

Discussion on condition of street by Shropshire home. Some work should be done where pavement (Cont. Board Meeting) and blacktop join.

Citizens at the meeting were Mrs. Forrest Roberts, Mrs. Harold Ouverson, Mike Haugen, and Orlo Ouverson.

Mrs. Ouverson and Mrs. Roberts discussed an information sheet that the Fertile Community Betterment Committee would like to put out for one of their 1977 projects. Committee would like Council Meeting published paper to be printed once a month. Committee would gather news and would like assistance from town to help pay for the mailing permit.

piscussion on sewer easements and sewer project. Mike Haugen wondered if contractors would be required to replace land in its original condition. There will be an open meeting with Walland and Holland, representatives, in the near future.

Orlo Ouverson brought a petition with 35 names to have the lagoon site changed to a different location. Council will find out proper procedure to follow and will report results.

Motion by Tuttle to give \$50 to Betterment Committee for information paper. Miller seconded. All Ayes.

Discussion on permission to plant petunias on town property. Council approved.

Discussion on the point of the park east of the highway. Reva Nelson called the Iowa Development Commission in Des Moines -- they would favor keeping the point in natural state, but the decision is up to the town.

Some citizens are in favor of blocking off the point. Others want parking put there off the road and a picnic area there.

Discussion on putting field stones on north river bank behind business places. It would look better from the park.

Discussion on giving news sheet \$10 per month for publishing town meetings.

Discussion on sewer loan and grants were all approved. Gary Vennerman from FHA was present and told the amounts of Loan and Grant.

Only hold up now is "Right of Ways" folder, which is the easements. Council authorized Vennerman to proceed as planned.

Motinn by Miller to authorize Jo Ann Bailey, clerk, to transfer Certificates of Deposit, 5771, 5534, and 5535 from General Fund to Road Use Fund. Morse seconded. All Ayes.

Morse to get prices on more playground equipment for the park.

Discussion on Lake Street between Thelan Elthon's lot and Mrs. Esther Haugen's property. Will table until next meeting. A survey will be taken to see if people are in favor of selling the West ' half of Lake Street. There would be a 33' alley to the river.

Motion by Tuttle to pay bills. Berg seconded. All Ayes.

Motion by Morse for adjournment. Tuttle seconded. All Ayes.
