#### VOTE

Municipal election in Fertile will be Tuesday, November 6. Voting will be at the Fertile Library. Polls will be open 12 noon to 8 FM.

Six candidates have filed for the five seats open on the Fertile Council. Incumbents Jean VanDenBosch, R. L. Worsley, and Dennis Faber join Tom Hewitt, Kenneth Lundgren and Fred Hare on the ballot.

The top 3 majority votes will be for 4 year terms. The next two will be for 2 year terms.

The seat of mayor will again be filled by write-in vote as the current mayor larry Shropshire, is not running and other candidates have filed. The office of mayor remains a 2 year term.
