# SEPTEMBER RECIPE OF THE MONTH HOBO SURPRISE

1 lb. ground beef 1/2 c oatmeal Mix well. 1 t salt pepper 2/3 c tomato juice ) 1 egg, beaten 1 square of aluminum foil for each serving (1 square foot). On each piece of foil, place several 1 slices of raw carrots and salt. Next several 2" slices of raw potato. Top with pat of butter. Then a thin slice of onion for those that like it. Place a mond of meatloaf mixture over carrots, potatoes and onions in igloo fashion, hiding ingredients inside. Tightly fold the foil, roll edges up tightly and place on cookie sheet. Bake 350° for 1 hour (depending on size).
