At this month's Council Meeting usual problems plus a few new ones were on the agenda. One was the monthly discussion on dogs. Living within community should cause each member of that community to do whatever is necessary to be a good neighbor. And being a good neighbor includes keeping your dogs on your own property at times and making sure their barking not causing a disturbance at any time any one. It is treating your neighbor like you want them to treat you. And tht concept starts with each one of whether it is dogs, dust, noise, oddrs, junk, or whatever.

But a more serious problem is common practice of quite a few young children, and older ones, roaming the streets late at night. Yes, we could, as the governing body within the town of Fertile, establish a curfew. But | it seems to us that this is a problem that individual families should be handling. Given the environment in which our kids are growing up, we have a hard time understanding parents who seemingly don't know where their children are, nor do they seem to care. Certainly, just scanning the daily newspapers or watching the evening TV news should be incentive enough to make any parent determined to do all they can to make sure their kids are safe and will grow up to become responsible members of society. We are asking you, the parents, to check on your kids, see if they are part of the groups roaming around late at night. And if they are, exercise your authority and get some discipline in their lives. This would be a much better solution for all concerned, than for the council to have to take appropriate action. Gardening Hints from club members: October is great planting season for bulbs and winter leaf losing trees and shrubs. Good soil preparation is important and the quality of soil beneath them. For trees, make holes sufficiently deep and considerably larger than spread of roots. Improve soil in bottom of hole by forking deeply and then add generous amounts of fertilizer and some bone meal.
