When I, Helen Humphrey Ouverson, was a young girl my parents and my sisters, Edith, Amy, Maud and my brother Earl lived with my parents on their farm which was within the Fertile City limits, just on top of the hill west of Fertile. I remember Mr. Hjelmeland, who was the Lutheran minister, and his family. They lived a few blocks east of the Lutheran Church, and I remember he had a large family. I'm not sure of all the names in order, but I remember there were Andrew, Sophia, Mrs. Wilbur Anderson, Mrs. Leo (Synneva) Elthon, Olaf, Ruth, Martin, Leonard, Annette and the baby Agnes, my age.

A. A. Elthon owned and operated the Elthon store. A. A. Elthon's store was on the south side of the street near the Riverside Cafe between the street and the Winnebago River. Mr. Elthon and Mr. Hjelmeland were J.D. Nelson's grandparents, I believe.

I think Ruth and Annette were in the same girls' basketball team as my sister Maud, and they got to go to Des Moines to the girls' tournament. Earl and I seldom got to play with the town kids because we had chores and work to do. Ruth Ivene Elthon is J.D.'s mother. She and my daughter, Phyllis were good friends. They played basketball together.

My husband, Edwin Ouverson, was one of Wilbur Anderson's pupils in about the 8th grade.

Mr. and Mrs. Elthon had two boys, Leo and Thelan Elthon, and some girls, Mabel Esther, Ada and Ruth. Elthons lived in Fertile too, and Thelan and his wife, Lillian still live in Fertile near the river. They have a very good view of the river and wild life - ducks, geese, and deer. Thelan feeds hay and corn to the wild life in the winter time.

I remember you could buy corn and grapes in small baskets and my parents had a few hens. We gathered the eggs twice a day and I would carry this grape basket full of eggs to Elthon's store and buy my mother's groceries. Once in a while I could buy a nickel's worth of candy to take home for all of us — maybe one piece for each of us. It was good.

Some of the town kids were Lyra Deuel, Mrs. Norman Oswald, Rueben Rogberg, Thelan Elthon, Alpha, Mildred and Palmer Ouverson.

My cousins John and Nellie Humphrey had a pony. May, John's pony, was sorrel and we got to ride her, but had to be careful where we put our feet or we found ourselves on the ground, and that tickled John. Nellie's was black and white. He was older and didn't buck you off. The town kids all wanted to ride, so the ponies had a busy day.

We lived where Louelle Felland lives and Uncle Ed and his family lived just west of us.

I received a small gold colored pen on a chain for my graduation in

1926 and a girlfriend liked it and I let her have it to wear, and she lost it. We could never find it. When I moved into my house in Fertile I had a space on the north side of my house planted for a garden. I went out to plant potatoes, and in the first spade full of dirt I found my small gold pen and chain all in one piece. After being washed it looked almost the same as when it was lost. It had lain in the dirt from 1926 until 1974. I was glad to find it.

Lyra and her mother Sophie Deuel lived with Sophie's father, K. O. Sheimo at that time. Sophie was a sister to Phil Sheimo. I visited Lyra in their home many times when Lyra and I were in high school. I wish they could know that the lost pen and chain were found.

ter a short honeymoon, they came home to build a house on the farm Clyde's dad was farming and he farmed with him until grandpa Buckley died. When his Mother moved to Forest City, Clyde & Viola and 2 sons Jerrold and David moved into the farm house and continued to farm the 240 acres. Viola did substitute teaching now and then and Janet was born here in 1948.

In 1949 they purchased 160 acres near Kensett and found out what a job moving was. While here, Viola operated the Northwood Sales Barn Lunch Room for 7 years, 2 of these years she owned the Clear Lake Sales Barn Cafe too.

They sold the farm after 10 years and moved to a neighboring farm for 1 year while looking for a farm to purchase. They rented the Merle Hill farm near Fertile for 2 years then bought it. While farming, Clyde worked for Bob Haugen Sodding, Colby Peat Company, and Arco Chemical Company.

In 1971, Pat Nissen rented the farm and is

still farming it.

Clyde continued to work off the farm until hetired in 1984. He has fished in Canada e. I year. Now he gardens and cares for a large yard.. Winters he has cut and sold wood.

Viola began work at the Forest City Hospital a month after they moved onto the present farm. For 14 years in charge of diets, 3 days a week and $9\frac{1}{2}$ years on the Nursing Staff as Ward Secretary until this job was included in other positions when Mercy Hospital took over.

Now Viola is catching up on all she couldnt do when working. She's doing Crafts, tends lots of flower beds, visits 2 nursing homes regularly, is active in Kum-Along Senior Citizens of Forest City, is secretary of Sarah Circle at Immanuel Lutheran Church, and belongs to the Fertile Garden Club. She hopes to do more traveling in the U.S.A. She says "What's wrong with a road runner? Who needs Valium if the gas tank is full?"

The Buckley's have 3 Children: Jerrold of Hanlontown, David of Kensett and Janet of Clarion. 10 Grandchildren, 3 Great-Grandchildren, and 1 Step-Great Grand Daughter.

And of Indian scares and of wolves galore,


There are hair-raising tales round the village store.





Grant Center Ia Jan 19, 1907

Dear Children

I will now try to write you a letter would have written before but have been sick have had the genuine Lagrippe but feel some better today although I am so weak I can handly walk around hope this will find you both

Leeling well

It has rained all the forenoon and turned to -now this afternoon we have had only snow lough up to the present time to make the ground white guess this will not amount to much either for as I look out I see it has nearly stoped 'We were down to Uncle Jims about a week ago He has been confined to the house for some time he has a dreadful cough and looks very bad he has been very poorly ever since we came from Dak. Pa seems about the same he is quite thin in flesh Wayne set traps and captured a s---k he skined it he has 3 or 4 good ones which he will ship after a while Roy and Gentie were here for a visit the other day They inquire about you but of course I cannot tell them very much as we have heard so little from you for the past two months but I suppose being a newly married man you have so many cares and such like that you do not have time to write but hope you will do better later

They are having revival meeting at Grant for two weeks past. The "Ladies Aid" meets at Roy's next Thursday for dinner Dell's have sold their farm and are going to move to Mason until they find another farm to buy. Fannie Tifft has gone way back East again They are draining Goose Lake and have found that it contains good peat for fuel to the depth of 16ft and also that here is the best of brick and tile clay just east of Fertile They expect to work both places

in the near future which will probably bring the long looked for railroad to tertile_There are four general merchandise stores at Fertile now Lang and Overson have enlarged their handware stone considerable We got a letter from Aunt Mary saying that Alice is no better Frank Willey is in Kansas this winter with Maude and Allen John you remember that bachelor that kept the lumber yard and run the elevator at I roy well he and Gentie (the girl that waited so long for him) are married. I got a nice letter from her the other day. I -suppose by this time you will know if you are to run the elevator at lake Wilson or not if you are and come home bring your trunk as Roys and we people want to give you something for a wedding present and if you are not coming soon we will send you something when we hear from you again so we will know where your future home is to be Carrie and Charly go by even day on two since they commenced house keeping well I guess there is nothing in the way of news so I will have to close. I thought that when there was two of you to write that we would get more letters Leola you can write if you are not acquainted we can get some acquainted that way and more when we meet which I hope will be before long Wayne says Hello! to you did you get some pictures taken will close with love and best wishes from Mother
