

10. I'd like to go to Iowa every year.



whole room? So now the pillows aren't quite right. Is that any reason for my husband to throw them in the trash can? Men! I'll never understand them!




#### TONI RENEE BOOK

Mike is the son of Robert and Sarah Engebretson and Dick Voortmann. He plans to work at Pizza Hut in Clear Lake.




#### **JOSEPH ELTHON**

She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jesus Ochoa of Fertile. Olga plans attending NIACC after graduation.




ALISA PEDERSON


