By the time you get this Fertile Reminder I am certain all of you have plans made for Thanksgiving. Perhaps some of you have invited company and already have started fixing your holiday fare or perhaps you are going as a guest and looking forward to a delicious meal that has been prepared for you. Whatever the case maybe, let us not forget to give thanks for all that we have — we are prone to take for granted all our blessings.

It seems such a short time from Thanksgiving until Christmas. I can remember in my younger days when the stores decorated the weekend following Thanksgiving and then everything seemed so exciting and we were thrilled at the sights. Now it just seems that the commercial Christmas just goes on and on.

Today I am remembering the Christmas joys we shared on the farm when we were growing up. Those were the days before we had electricity and all of the other things we now take for granted. We always shared Christmas Eve and it seemed so special to all of us. We had a huge coal heater in our dining room and early in the morning my mother started to really fire it up and then later in the day she would start to open the door into the living room a bit at a time and by supper time the room was cozy and warm. From this, you know our living room was not used in the winter time. Our dining room table was stretched to the limit as we tried to make room for everyone to sit around it. I can close my eyes and see, smell, and taste the wonderful ham my Mother prepared. In our neighborhood, we had an old man who had neither chick nor child and he was always invited to come and share with us. Several weeks before Christmas he would come and give my Mother a ten dollar bill and with that she bought this huge ham - I can't possibly think of how much it would cost today or if you could even buy such quality! I really can't remember much else we had to eat but I do know thickened raisin sauce was served with the ham.

know I passed that by as raisins have never been a favorite of mine.

There were several younger ones in our family circle and I can remember that they felt the older ones took too long to eat and to visit about the days happenings. Then those mountains of dirty dishes with our hot water coming from the reservoir in the kitchen stove and the tea kettle. For a change, the younger ones made themselves useful and helped the dishwashing cause along.

Now we always had fresh evergreen for our Christmas tree and it was anchored in a pail of wet sand. As long as we lived on the farm, it always stood in the middle of the living room floor and a chair for each of us circled the tree. lite real candles on the tree and I remember how careful we were to place the holders so they wouldn't touch the tree. Now I shudder when I think of what a fire hazard they were! only lights we had in the room was the lights from the candles and the room grew brighter and brighter as each candle was lite. Then we would stand and hold hands young and old and march around the tree singing Christmas Carols. This was a Danish tradition of my Mother's and how she loved it - when my parents moved into town there was not much room to do this and she always felt badly about that. Then the younger ones would recite the things they had for their programs so we had our own intimate Christmas program. We would always close by singing Silent Night, which was a favorite of my Mothers. Now it is a my favorite one, too, but I always get a lump when I sing it or * hear it sung as I remember the day that have long gone by and the many missing from our family circle.

By this time, the candles had burned down and it was time to blow them out. Next came passing out the gifts — it didn't take long for the paper to come off and each one examined their gift. As I remember in those days, whatever the gift, it usually came as a surprise.

I can so well remember that when I was sixteen my oldest sister gave me a candy thermometer — I really don't know why as we never made candy but what a wonderful gift it proved to be! It has been a part of my life — do I dare tell you for 53 years — and I could never begin to remember

how many times it has been used and it is as good and accurate as ever. Someday I shall pass it one to my Molly Bea.

It has been fun to share with ou a bit of long ago. I know nat each of you have fond memories - especially those of you of the older generation.

Friday, Septmber 30th, was the culmination of a little girl's favorite playtime and an adult lady's dream. That was the day my Mom, Maxine Scobee retired from the Post Office in 50434. Mom had worked for the Postal Departnt over 31 years and had been the Fertile Postmaster for the last nine ars.

She had told me how when she was a little girl she would play 'sorting mail'. She would set up boxes to look like mail boxes and 'sort' paper and envelopes in them. There were times when she ran errands for her aunt and uncle, the Charles Eikenberrys, then the Fertile Postmaster and maybe earn a nickel—big money for a little girl.

When we moved to Fertile in 1959, Mom again looked to the Post Office. Aunt Ann (Eikenberry) was then the Postmaster in the building on the south side of the street. Ella Seglem was Clerk and Mom was hired as Assistant Clerk. Thinking back, who can help but remember the smell of fresh bread baking at the apartment behind the Post Office while Aunt Anna and Aunt Junie baked their bread. Those were the days when you could mail a letter for 7 cents and a penny post card cost 3 cents. At that time you could pick up your mail and visit the drug and candy store all in one stop. That card table filled with bits and pieces of candy was a temptation to all kids.

Years passed. Aunt Anna and Ella retired, the times changed, and the Post Office moved to the present building and Mom continued to work occassionally. She worked at various local Post Offices spending nearly one and one-half years at the Forest City office. Then Mike Purcell retired and Mom was appointed Officer In Charge at Fertile before being appointed to her life-long ambition--being the Postmaster of Fertile, Iowa--her home town.

Yes, the mail still continues to go out, stamps are still sold, packages still mailed. But Mom's smiling face will be missed. Now it's time for her to enjoy sleeping late, to travel south in winter, and to do all the things she's only dreamed of doing.

I wish her many years of enjoying Dad's company as they retire in Fertile,
