Word has been received of the death of a former Fertile resident, Mrs. Margaret (Bernard) Bell. She passed away on August 23, 1993 at the age of 88 years at Iowa City, Ia. where she had resided for the past years. The Bells farmed in this area for many years. They moved to Iowa City 25 years ago where Bernard died in 1985. She is survived by three daughters and the families; Katherine Soderholm of Wheeling, Ill., Beverly Beck of Joliet, Ill. and Delores (Lori) Mick of Blacksburg, Va. Our deepest sympathy is extended to the family.

NEWS UPDATE ON FLOOD DAMAGE TO PARK - Our dam and dike have not escaped damage from

the excessive rain. They have felt the stress of the high water level.

We were contacted in July by Dave Brammel, who is with the Worth County Emergency Water Shed Program, informing us of funds made available by the Federal Government. These funds were in forms of grants to help pay for any damage received by the rains. At that me a report was being sent in from the EWSP as to damage around the county. If any was ceived they were contacting each community. We were concerned about the dam and dike. At that time this concern was conveyed to Mr. Brammel. This would make us eligible (possibly) for a grant. More simply put, our name got on the first list being sent in. The grants would pay 80% and we would pay 20% of the cost of repairs.

Since then the representative from Fema has been here to survey the dam but the dike still had to much water to be able to see any damage. He did file on his report of the washed away part of the dam wall. The county people were here and filed their report also, the water still at that time was to high to see if any damage had been done to the dike.

We had a special council meeting to apply for the grants. Forms were brought to Fertile by Bev Kaduce that needed to be signed and sent in. One form was for the county and one form was for federal assistance. They were signed and sent in.

Since that time Richard Sallens, who is with the Corporation of Engineers, came to inspect the dam and dike. He was here the 24th and 25th of August. We also have a hole in the dike. Pictures were taken of the dike and dam area, also an aerial picture was included in his report. He made sure those pictures showed the residents and businesses along the river to the north of the dam. His feeling was that having houses and businesses along this area would possible help us in receiving grants.

Our dike will need more than to be repaired. It will have to be dug out and filled in with rock to have a strong base. As long as is is just dirt it will eventually wash away, which it is doing now. On his findings the dike could go at any time. We will know within a week if we will receive any grants. As Mr. Sallens explained the grants are meant to repair as it exists but in this case he has reported it needs improvements. It was also documented the shelter houses, restrooms, play ground equipment, horseshoe pits, and picnic tables and grills, tennis court and basketball hoops did exist in the park. He also stated that any repairs caused by the high waters to tables, restrooms, etc., receipts re to kept and sent in.

Also we will get two estimates to the cost of repairing the dam wall and the dike. the dike happens to go, I don't think we'll have to worry about cleaning the park.

We felt that the citizens of Fertile needed to be aware of the condition of the dam and dike and what we're doing about taking care of the problem. We are doing everything we can to fix the problems and get help doing it. We have applied for the grants made available to us by the County and Federal Government.

We will keep you informed of the progress and checking on status of where we stand in possibly receiving grant money. All we can tell you at this time is that it is going through the channels and we're waiting for word. We should know in about a month or less.





A total of \$282 was made at the dunk tank, well worth our time in the swing and the 10 gallons of water that we swallowed.


A BIG thank you to Arnie Hauge for all his work with the baseball tournament & the Pennies in the Corn, which was a BIG HIT!!!!!


I would like to do something for the Memory Tree program this year in November, but I need all you Fertile Reminder Subscribers to help me.

## 1993 LITTLE LEAGUE REPORT

After having many fund raisers last year (1992) the Fertile Little League started out the 1993 year with \$2944.10. The board decided since they did not have any major projects, that they would not have any fund raisers in '93. \$143 was sent into Little League from parents and grandparents through the Fertile Reminder request.

The cost to play ball this year in Fertile was \$10.00 per child or \$20.00 per family. This is very cheap compared to towns around us.

Thank you to all of the parents who helped in so many ways. We ended our season with about \$2600.00. Now we want you to remember that we had no major projects this year. Next year a few projects will be; batting cage, popcorn popper and some uniforms. So, don't eat any hot dogs during the winter so you will be hungry for them next spring. Seriously, what a wonderful sight it was to go up to the ball diamond night after night and see so many youngsters enjoying themselves. Sometimes there were as many as 4 teams practising at once or 2 teams playing ball games. You always knew when there was a game because of all the traffic in town.





This picture was taken six years later about 1930, Im sure some of you will remember them.




