CITY COUNCIL NEWS

The Fertile City Council met April 2, 2002 at 7:00 PM in Fertile City Hall. Present were Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Persons Tad Miller, Tammy Hall, Tanya Olson, Jeff Berg and Richard Bruns. Also present Tom Kirschbaum, City Superintendent. Matt Berry, City Attorney was introduced as the new city attorney. Mr. Berry then reviewed the recommended changes in the new ordinances with the council and Chris Diggens representing NIACOG. Tad Miller moved, Tanya Olson seconded to accept the revised ordinances. Passed. After a lengthy discussion it was agree a Flood Plain Management Ordinance public hearing will be held May 7, 2002 at 7:00 PM Council Meeting. Fred Hare of Hare Electric explained the problems incurred by the generator at the lagoon. He recommended rebuilding the switch. Olson moved, Bruns 2nd to order parts and repair the generator. Passed. Underwear had to be removed again from the sewer pump. It is not known how this is getting in the sewer system. Terry McCarthy and Thomas Madden of Yaggy Colby Associates detailed the steps needed to be done to bring Fertile into compliance with their DNR Permit for sewage disposal. Yaggy Colby will assist Fertile. Volunteers will inspect all the manholes and make a detailed report of manhole condition. This will be started May 11, 2002 at 10:00 AM. The pumps must be calibrated once a year. Dye testing of the sewer pipes will be done. The council agreed to volunteer tasks and report to Yaggy Colby of their

accomplishments. All DNR correspondence will be forwarded to Yaggy Colby. Tanya moved to buy needed street and traffic control signs at the most reasonable cost. Hall 2nd. Passed. Berg moved to proceed with the Hazard Mitigation Plan, Bruns 2nd. Passed. The plan is encouraged by the state who pays most of the cost of formulating the plan. It will be used in case of a disaster striking the town of Fertile. Tom gave a report on summer street improvement. Before the pile at the lagoon can be burned the LP tank must be moved. Bruns will speak with Nelson Petroleum about getting this moved. This is the year the water tower is painted. Russell will contact the Watertower Painting Company. Earth day is April 22, 2002. The park clean-up is planned for Saturday, April 27, 2002. The council was invited to the FB&I meeting April 4, 2002. A decision will be made on the footbridge. The Fertile Day Celebration will be August 10 & 11. Olson reviewed the City Census and reported no reason to contest. The items tabled until the May Meeting include repairs oh the community center, tree trimming and auditor. The Fertile Garden Club will have a Plant Sale May 4, 2002 in the Fertile City Hall. Berg moved to approve the expenditures, Olson 2nd. Passed. The meeting adjourned at 10:30PM

Fertile Beautification and Improvement Meeting 7:00 PM Fertile City Hall

Chairman Kristen Andersen called the meeting of the Fertile Beautification and Improvement (FB&I) to order at 7:00 PM. Present were Kristen Andersen, Tom Kirschbaum, Gloria Kirschbaum, Evelyn Elthon, Jane Ramon, Karen Usher. Also present were Terry Elthon, Lois Anderson, Goldie Felland, Al Ramon, James Lovick, Carolyn Nedved, Mayor Joyce Russell, Arnie Hauge.

Rick Scholbrock of Hanlontown requested a Youth Tractor Pull be included in the Fertile Day Celebration. Available dates are 7:00 PM August 10 or Noon on Sunday August 11. Mr. Scholbrock stated he will be responsible for all fundraising and supervision of the event. The FB&I will discuss the pull and get back to Mr. Scholbrock with their answer. Mr. Scholbrock exited the meeting.

The public hearing on the Fertile Footbridge was held. Interested community citizens voiced opinions on the selection of the contractor to construct the bridge. The preference vote was 5 in favor of Continental Bridge and 8 in favor of Joe Elthon. James Lovick and Al Ramon exited the meeting. Discussion continued on the bridge selection. It was decided to contact Joe Elthon . Tom Kirschbaum called Joe Elthon and requested he complete the bid sheet sent to him February 7,2002, no later than April 9, 2002. Discussion of the bridge project continued. It is the feeling of the FB&I that the bid go to the lowest bid as was intended February 7, 2002 when the bid sheet was prepared. Meeting Adjourned.

This is response to the questionnaire.

The bridge will be a steel arch with the opening width at 6'-4" and 3'-6" at the center. The arch rises 6' above the abutments. The pickets are steel angles spaced so there is only a 4" gap in between them. The railing will be 36" above deck. The decking will be 2x6 redwood oak, stained and sealed for weathering.

To keep costs down, the delivery will be in two shipments. By shipping the bridge in two smaller loads I have avoided extra costs of permits and escort vehicles. The first shipment will include the first half of the bridge plus the anchor plates, lights, and necessary equipment to build the abutments. The cost is included in the materials above. I will need to be there to oversee the construction of the abutments. The second half of the bridge will follow once the abutments have cured, roughly two weeks. I will also be there to oversee the craning of the bridge on sight.

The lifting weight will be roughly 10,000 pounds. I am working with an engineering friend of mine on the abutments reactions; we think we can bring this down even more. The final reactions are yet to be determined but I will have the designs for the abutments

We offer a standard two-year warranty on all our products.

Thank you for considering me to build the entire bridge for the City of Fertile. I would consider it the greatest of honors if you grant me Fertile Bridge project.

CORN-STARCH CAKE

4 egg whites

1 cup white sugar

1/2 cup whole milk (less rich with 2%)

2 teaspoons baking powder

1 cup flour

Lemon flavoring (you decide the amount)

Cream sugar and butter, mix cornstarch with milk, combine all and bake. Bake at 350° oven for 30 min. or until top springs back when you touch the center.
