### **COOKS' CORNER**

This is a timely recipe with Apples now coming in. Maybe y have some extra and don't want them to go to waste.  $h, \exists s$  a good way to do them up. It can be used on waffles/pancakes or ice cream!

#### APPLE PIE IN A JAR -

4 1/2 cups white sugar
1 cup cornstarch
2 tsp. ground cinnamon
1/4 tsp. Ground nutmeg
1 tsp. Salt
10 cups water
3 tbsp. Lemon juice
7 quarts peeled, cored & sliced apples

- Have 7 1 quart canning jars, lids & rings sterilized. (Don't put your flats in the dishwashers as it is hard on the rubber and they may not seal.)
- Combine sugar, cornstarch, cinnamon, nutmeg, salt, and water in a large saucepan. Place over high heat & cook until thick and bubbly, stirring frequently. Re move from the heat and stir in lemon juice.
- 3. Tightly pack apples into the sterilized jars. Slowly pour syrup over apples, covering them completely. Gently tap jars on countertop to allow air bubbles to rise. Screw lids on jars.
- Carefully lower jars into pot using a holder. Leave a 2 inch space between jars. Add more boiling water if necessary, until tops of jars are <u>covered by 2 inches</u> <u>of water</u>. Bring water to a <u>full boil</u>, then cover and process for **30 minutes**.
- Remove jars very care after 30 minutes and place on a cloth-covered surface until cool. Once cool, press top of each lid with finger, ensuring that seal is tight (lids doesn't move up or down at all.) Sealed jars can be stored for up to a year.
