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FERTILE FIRE DEPARTMENT

It has come to our attention that some people are concerned about which ambulance service will respond to their address in an emergency. When our wonderful 911 system was set up, a decision was based upon response time, mileage and training for the responding ambulance service we use. For some individuals, an alternative preference may be requested based upon personal choice; you have the option of doing this. In our Fertile Fire District a 911 emergency call for medical assistance will alert the dispatcher to page out our department along with ambulance service. A predetermined ambulance service is automatically dispatched unless the caller requests another. We have continuing service with Snell's and the Forest City Ambulance services, with no complaints.

In the 9ll computer system, your address and/or phone number displays information, allowing the dispatcher to determine which emergency services are needed for your specific crisis. If you are unsure of who will respond, contact the Sheriff's Department using their Non-Emergency phone number and ask this dispatcher to verify for you. In Cerro Gordo County that number is 641-421-3000, for Worth County the number is 641-324-2481.

In the event that your address is currently set up for a non-preferred ambulance service of your choice, you may switch the predetermined service to one you prefer. This may be done for any one address, for or by the current tenant/property owner only. Contact your County EMS Director to make these changes for you, the Sheriff's Department can help you reach them.

As always, please feel free to contact a Fertile Fire Department Volunteer for more information. We are happy to serve you, and again THANK YOU FOR YOUR CONTINUED SUPPORT.

I'm fascinated by the way a simple phrase can change in its meaning over a couple generations. On New Year's Day I was talking with our daughter Julie and one of her friends about their progress in a weight loss program. The food regimens were tolerable and beginning to show some promise. When I asked them what they were doing for exercise, Julie's friend said, "I go to the gym three days a week." Some of those gyms are posh perspiration palaces, complete with stereophonic music, plush carpeted floors, ergonomically designed exercise machines, plus saunas and steam rooms that would make a Roman Emperor envious. That's what "going to the gym" means these days here in Lotus Land. This is not anywhere near the meaning of the phrase fifty years ago in Fertile, Iowa.

Our school gymnasium had been built at the end of the 1930's with funds from the WPA (Works Progress Administration, a New Deal "make work" program) and was the pride of the town. The building was well used for athletics, dramas, PTA meetings, banquets and other community activities, but on Saturdays it was usually unheated and unused. Les Lindquist, the custodian, was at work in the school house on Saturday, preparing the building for classes the following Monday. During winter week-ends the boys in town were permitted to play basketball in the gym as long as Les was on the premises. We would rattle the doors to get his attention and then ask if it would be alright for us to shoot some baskets. Most often it was no problem.

The practice basketballs were kept in canvas bags under the west end of the stage. Depending on how many kids were present we either divided up into teams for a pick-up game or just practiced shooting hoops. Sometimes we would compete by playing "horse." If the first player made his shot the subsequent players had to make the same shot from the same spot to continue. The next shot was from a different spot further from the basket. The game continued until someone missed the basket.

Street shoes would have damaged the floor so we played in our stocking feet those days. Sometimes the floor was almost too cold. In truth, I don't remember anyone ever saying he was going home because he had cold feet. Jerry Jenkins and his brothers were among the town boys who frequented the gym those Saturdays. Perhaps some of the skills which enabled the Fertile High School basketball team of which he was a part to go to the State tournament in the late 50's were honed on the hardwood those cold winter Saturday mornings.

Something of the town's pride in the gym had made its way into the minds of the kids. Rarely was there any damage to the building caused by wildly thrown balls or other mischief. As I have mentioned before, the school was a central magnet which held the community together as long as it operated in town. This was true not only with the formal activities, but also with the informal fun we had when we decided to go to the gym. The building is now referred to as the "Community Center." JUST BEING HELPFUL

It is important for men to remember that as women grow older it becomes harder for them to maintain the same quality of housekeeping as they did when they were younger. When men notice this, they should try not to yell. Let me relate how I handle the situation.

When I got laid off my counsulting job and took "early retirement" in January, it became necessary for Nancy to get a full time job, both for extra income and for health benefits that we need. She was a trained medical transcriptionist when we met twenty-eight years ago and was fortunate to land a job at a local transcription house. It was shortly after she started working at this job that I noticed that she was beginning to show her age.

I usually get home from fishing or hunting about the same time she gets home from work. Although she knows how hungry I am, she almost always says that she has to rest for half an hour or so before she starts supper. I try not to yell at her when this happens. Instead, I tell her too take her time, I understand that she is not as young as she used to be. I just tell her to wake me when she finally does get supper on the table.

She used to wash and dry the dishes as soon as we finished eating. It is now not unusual for them to sit on the table for several hours after supper. I do what I can by reminding her several times each evening that they aren't cleaning themselves. I know she appreciates this, as it does seem to help her get them done before she goes to bed.

Our washer and dryer are in the basement. When she was younger, Nancy used to be able to go up and down stairs all day and not get tired. Now that she is older she seems to get tired so much more quickly. Sometimes she says she just can't make another trip down those steps. I don't make a big issue of this. As long as she finishes the next evening I am willing to overlook it. Unless I need something ironed to wear to the Monday lodge meeting or to Wednesday or Saturday poker club or to Tuesday or Thursday bowling or something like that, I will tell her to wait until the next evening to do the ironing. This gives her a little more time to do some of those odds and ends things like shampooing the dog, vacuuming or dusting. Also, if I have a really good day fishing, this allows her to gut and scale the fish at a more leisurely pace.

Nancy is starting to complain a little, occasionally. Not often, mind you, but just enough for me to notice. For example, she will say that it is difficult for her to find time to pay the monthly bills during her lunch hour. In spite of her complaining, I continue to try to offer encouragement. I tell her to stretch it out over two or even three days. That way she won't have to rush so much. I also remind her that missing lunch completely now and then wouldn't hurt her any, if you know what I mean.

When doing simple jobs she seems to think she needs more rest periods than she used to have to take. A couple weeks ago she said she had to take a break when she was only half finished mowing the yard. I overlook comments like these because I realize it's just age talking. In fact, I try not to embarrass her when she needs these little extra rest breaks. I tell her to fix herself a nice, big, cold glass of freshly squeezed lemonade and just sit for a while. I even offer to have one with her, as she may as well make one for me too, and take her break by the hammock so she can talk to me until I fall asleep.

I could go on and on, but I think you know where I'm coming from. I know I probably look like a saint in the way I support Nancy on a daily basis. I'm not saying that the ability to show this much consideration is easy. Many men will find it difficult. Some will find it impossible. No one knows better than I how frustrating women can become as they ge older.

My purpose in writing this is to simply suggest you make the effort. Achieving the exemplary level of consideration I have attained is out of reach for the average man. However, guys, even if you just yell at your wife a little less often because of this article, I will consider that writing it was worthwhile.
