Windy, the Well-Driller Neil L. Kuns June 15, 1995

"You never miss the water 'til the well runs dry." Not many wells ran dry in Fertile, Iowa, my tiny home town. It rains a lot in the region, and most of the water sinks into the soil rather than running off. Well drillers usually struck water after thirty to forty feet of drilling. Before the 1940's people had to pump their water by hand, and not every house had its own well. Because good water was so abundant most homeowners with wells were willing to let their neighbors pump all they needed. When electric pumps became popular and affordable in the 40's many of these private wells were fitted with the new equipment. This called for the removal of the old cast-iron hand pumps. These wells didn't run dry -they just went under cover -- but the result was the removal of the water supply for their neighbors without a well. Shutting off the water turned on a fountain of business opportunities for those who had the equipment and also knew how to drill a well.

In the years after I left Fertile the town's own Frank Orcutt tended that fountain, but during the 30's and 40's the townspeople had to import this talent from Hanlontown, three miles down the road. The driller's name was George Davis, but everyone called him Windy. He was never at a loss for words, and having nothing to say usually didn't keep him from saying it. Some such talkative types are called blowhards. Windy blew soft to medium. His wind was more of a zephyr than a blizzard, more of a breeze than a gale. The kids in town liked him, probably because he was never too busy talk to them about what he was doing. He did seem to know what he was doing.

Windy the well-driller got the job when the people who lived at the corner Mill and Main Streets decided to put down their own well. He maneuvered his machine into position so the well would be in the desired place close to the house. Mr. Davis' machine depended on gravity to drive the heavy drill bit into the ground and the through the layers of limestone. The going was easy through the first few feet of loose loam. When the bit hit the stone things slowed down, but progress continued. Windy drained water into the hole to help wash out the pulverized rock. He baled this slurry of water and rocks from the well with an attachment on the rig, and studied this waste as it drained out of the bale. As long as it looked like limestone he kept drilling. When limestone gave way to gravel he knew he had reached the porous vein in which fresh water flowed, and his work was almost done.

Both the well driller and his equipment fascinated me. In the weeks after he drilled that well I made a small working wooden model of the machine, complete with wheels, belts, boom and the reciprocating arm that lifted and dropped the drill bit. Our family moved two or three times after I made the model, and as other interests occupied my mind I lost track of the little model. Several times in recent years I've searched the closets of my Mother's home for the model, but I have never located it. Wouldn't it be funny if one day I found it in an antique shop, an example of a primitive toy? Who knows? -- maybe it is still out there someplace. You never miss the water well-driller until you can't find it.

CODK'S KORNER

I went to a Tupperware Party awhile back and they now have pans and bowls that you can e in the microwave and they fixed the followung two recipes.

Oreo Cookie Dessert (Very rich!!) 1 package Oreo Cookies (3 row package) 1 jar Hot Fudge Topping (12.25 oz.) 1 can Cherry Pie Filling (approx. 1 lb.)

Break up all but 6 of the Oreo cookies in a glass or Tupperware (micro safe kind) 9x 7x 2"+

Pour 1 can Cherry Pie Filling over the crumbled cookies. Spoon on the Hot Fudge and spread around. Crumble the last 6 cookies over the top and cover with plastic wrap. Poke a fork through the wrap a couple times and put in the microwave. I have a 1000 watt and I bake it for 8-10 minutes at full power. If you have a larger oven, cut the power to 70%

Apple Pie Dessert

1 package Archway Golden Oatmeal (15 cook-

ar Caramel Topping (12.25 oz)

1 can Apple Pie filling (1 lb. can (approx)

Crumble all but 5 of the cookies into a 9x7 glass or microwave safe pan. Pour apple filling over the top. Spoon the Caramel over the top and spread it out. Crumble the other 5 cookies over the top. Microwave for 8-10 minutes at full power if 1000 watt. Go to 70% if higher wattage.

These recipes only take a few minutes to make if you have unexpected company coming and not much time. They are delicious with ice cream on top while they are still warm!!
