City Council Meeting Minutes

October 21, 2008, 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session, October 21, 2008, at Fertile City Hall.

Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Members: Cindy Peters, Pat Renchin, and Gail Shropshire, City Clerk Eddie May, and City Maintenance Manager Craig Koch. Absent were: Council Members: Jeff Berg and Tad Miller.

Minutes Approval

 Renchin motioned and Shropshire 2nd to approve the September minutes. Motion Carried

Mayor's Report

- On 9/22 a Judge ordered the owners of 115 West Main Street to comply with nuisance ordinances pertaining to debris, weeds, and the state of the building. A \$750 fee was imposed with a December 16th compliance date.
- Several other property owners have been notified to comply with the same ordinances. To date, only three have not responded to the City's request. Legal action will be taken against those who do not respond.
- FEMA has provided the specs for a new emergency siren for the City of Fertile. The siren will cost \$17,688. The City will be applying for a grant to cover the costs. The siren will be triggered by the Worth County Sherriff's department. The current siren will still be used for the "noon bell."
- Craig passed the drug test and physical and has a clean background check. Craig started his position three weeks ago.
- The Fire Department has been putting their new doors into their new building. Once the construction is done, an open-house fundraiser will be scheduled.
- Yaggy-Colby has inspected the park bridges to insure safety following this year's floods. Both the drive-in bridge and the footbridge have passed inspections.
- FEMA has presented the City with a new map outlining the flood plain for FEMA purposes. This new map does not supersede the current flood plain maps created for insurance purposes.
- On 10/11 a wedding was held in the park.
- The Senior Citizens group is looking into the possibility of replacing the steps to the park bandstand.
- Mayor Russell closed the meeting for 15 minutes.
- Mayor Russell re-opened the meeting.
- Mayor Russell met with Forest City leaders to discuss opportunities for future partnerships. Forest City provides emergency evacuation services for the City of Fertile in the case of disasters.
- If a building, which has both water and sewer hook-ups, is empty, the owners of the building are still responsible for the minimum water and sewer rates.
- Halloween will be observed on 10/31 from 5:00 to 8:00 in the City of Fertile.
- The Library will hold their annual Halloween party on Monday, 10/27 with a special haunted trolley ride.

City Clerk's Report

- May presented the September financials.
- May presented the annual reports for the sewer and water systems required by the USDA.
- May presented the first draft of an Identity Theft Policy. The policy will be presented for adoption next month.
- Peters motioned and Renchin 2nd to approve the September Expenditures. Motion Carried.

City Maintenance Report

- Warren and Buck have been helping to train Craig.
- Craig is now maintaining the parks and watching the numbers at the water and sewer plants.
- The new computer monitoring system is being installed by Hare Electric this week.

Committee Reports

No Committee reports were presented.

Other Business

- Shropshire asked for letters of recommendation from the Council, Mayor and City Clerk in regards to the IDED Housing Fund Grant.
- A big thanks to the Fertile Garden Club for fall decorations on Main Street Looks great!

- The Fertile City Council will meet at 7:00PM in regular session, November 18, 2008, at Fertile City Hall.
- Budget discussions will begin at the next meeting.

Identity Theft Prevention Program

- Mayor Russel presented the Identity Theft Prevention Program as required by the Federal Trade Commission. The Council decided on additional security measures.
- Miller motioned and Peters 2nd to approve the Identity Theft Prevention Program for the City of Fertile. Roll Call Vote was Unanimous. Motion Carried.
- A copy of the program is available for review at City Hall.

Mayor's Report

- The Library's Halloween party was a success. THANK YOU to everyone who helped.
- Mayor Russell attended a Workman's Comp One Call Nurse Program teleconference.
- FEMA was here twice during the last month for more paperwork.
- The Election process here at City Hall went well. THANK YOU to all who helped.

- Warren Bruns is now salaried as the Water and Sewer Superintendant.

Mix into shortening mix until smooth and then spoon into greased and flowered 9" square pan.

Bake 350° for 25-30 minutes

Serve with hot Vanilla, Lemon, Nutmeg Sauce. SAUCE– 1 cup sugar, 2 tbsp cornstarch in sauce pan. Stir in gradually 2 cups boiling water. BOIL 1 minute—stirring constantly. Add 4 tbsp BUTTER, 2 tsp. Vanilla or 2 tsp. Lemon juice with 1 tbsp. Grated lemon rind or 2 tsp. Nutmeg. Serve hot over pudding.
