City Council Meeting Minutes September 16, 2008, 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session, September 16, 2008, at Fertile City Hall.

Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Members: Jeff Berg, Tad Miller, Cindy Peters, Pat Renchin, Gail Shropshire, and City Clerk Eddie May, City Manager Warren Bruns and Maintenance Worker Buck Russell.

Minutes Approval

• Miller motioned and Renchin 2nd to approve the August minutes. Motion Carried.

Public Hearing-IDED Housing Fund

- Mayor Russell announced that this was the time and place for a Public Hearing, as per published notice, regarding authorization to submit a Housing Fund grant application to the Iowa Department of Economic Development for an owner-occupied housing rehabilitation program in a target area of the community.
- Steve Wendt of NIACOG made several comments during the public hearing in order to inform the Council and Citizens in attendance, about the application and the grant program. This included:
 - how the need for a rehabilitation program was identified (starting with the City of Fertile Comprehensive Housing Needs Assessment completed in 1999)
 - proposed budget, which identified sources and uses of funds, including the requested amount of the Housing Fund grant;
 - the date that the application needs to be submitted to IDED (by no later than November 21, 2008)
 - statement that 100% of the federal funds will benefit LMI Households (income limits based on family size were shown), discussion of the target area (a map was provided)
- the nature of the proposed grant activity (examples of likely work to be completed for the assisted homeowners were given)
- a statement no persons or businesses will be displaced as a result of the proposed rehabilitation activity
- Steve Wendt also fielded questions from the Council and from Citizens in attendance.
- There were no written objections and no oral objectors at the hearing.
- The Mayor then declared the Hearing to be closed.
- Miller motioned and Renchin 2nd to adopt Resolution #08-09-16 approving a 2009 Housing Fund grant application and committing local funds of \$12,000. Unanimous Roll Call Vote. Resolution passed.

Community Development & Housing Needs Assessment

- Steve Wendt of NIACOG presented an updated assessment outlining community development and housing needs of low and moderate income persons, other community development and housing needs, planned or potential activities to address housing and community needs.
- Peters motioned and Shropshire 2nd to approve the assessment. Unanimous Roll Call Vote. Motion Carried.

Tom Monson – Special Building Permit

 Mayor Russell presented a drawing detailing a requested security fence to be attached to Tom Monson's garage. The fence would be 8ft when the City Ordinances state that privacy fences cannot be higher than 6ft. special building permitting an 8ft security fence. Unanimous Roll Call Vote, Motion Carried.

Maintenance Position Applications Review

- Mayor Russell presented two applications received by City Hall. After 2 formal interviews, Mayor Russell, Buck Russell, Warren Bruns and Eddie May suggest the hiring of Craig Koch.
- Berg motioned and Renchin 2nd to approve the hiring of Craig Koch, contingent upon a clean background check, drug test and physical. Unanimous Roll Call Vote. Motion Carried,

Chris Anderson - Updates

- The FB&I committee is disbanding. The money in their savings will be turned over to City Hall for the funding of a shelter house at the ball fields.
- The Council will discuss the options for revising the committee.
- Little League has applied for a Minnesota Twins Foundation grant. If awarded, the grant could possibly pay for new bleachers, dug outs, back stops, fences and/or a new infield.

Mayor's Report

- Several vehicles were found running donuts in the ball fields. Four cars were apprehended by the Worth County Sherriff's Department for running donuts in the park.
- Clapper Tree Services took down a tree that had been struck by lightning over the veteran's memorial. He also trimmed up several trees in the park and at the ball fields.
- Waupaca is now taking brush. Please stop by the office before dumping.
- The City wants to thank the Rural Water Association for their continued support and service for our system.
- Three Coyotes have been seen in town. Please keep an eye out for your pets.
- Thompson's Garage has been purchased by Frank's Repair of Hanlontown.

City Clerk's Report

- · May presented the August financials.
- Renchin motioned and Miller 2nd to approve a lien against the property at 605 West Washington for unpaid utility bills. Motion Carried.
- Berg motioned and Miller 2nd to approve the August Expenditures. Motion Carried.

City Maintenance Report

 The regulatory controls at the water plant have not recovered from the shut-down caused by the water main break this spring. It is functioning, but is needing a lot of baby-sitting. The cost of a new system is \$16,280. If the system crashes, the City would be without any water for several days while a new system is being ordered and installed.

- Renchin motioned and Miller 2nd to approve the purchase of a new regulatory system. Motion Carried.
- A couple of fire hydrants will have their insides replaced due to scized up mechanisms.
- Bruns and Russell will help the new maintenance person assemble a procedures manual for the position.

Committee Reports

- The County will be maintaining 1st street where the new culvert was installed. This area will be blacktopped next spring after the ground has had time to settle.
- The owner of 501 West Washington has been asked, by the City, to mow his yard. If he does not, the City can mow his yard and charge him.
- The Community Center floor design is being reviewed by area architects who will be submitting proposals for services

- Brian Nettleton will be re-excavating the ditches along West Washington before winter. They will be smoothed and re-seeded.
- The trial between the City and the owners of 115 West Main Street, scheduled for Sept 10th has been postprountil Sept 22nd.

Upcoming Meetings

 The Fertile City Council will meet at 7:00PM in regular session, October 21, 2008, at Fertile City Hall.

Adjourn – Miller moved, Renchin 2nd to adjourn. Meeting adjourned.

CERRO GORDO COUNTY WAR

From George Kisner's book "Childhood on the Farm"

Although never recorded in history books, some of the fiercest battles of Cerro Gordo County took place on our farm in 930's. My mother came from a family of eight children

with strong Irish heritage. Every year or two, they would all get together for a family reunion. Since they were scattered from central Minnesota to southeast Iowa, our farm, 15 miles from the Minnesota border, was a logical meeting place.

My mother would begin preparing for weeks ahead for this event and made sure all of us children had clean clothes with no holes or patches. The women and girls always slept in the house, but the men and boys got to sleep in the hay loft on the fresh hay. I have no idea how everyone was fed, but I have fond memories of kindly aunts urging me to have more pie or cookies. Also, our old ice cream freezer came out and we children turned the crank seemingly for hours with delicious results.

After the big noon meal, the adults would all sit around and participate in the most vicious family arguments I have ever heard. Politics and religion were usually the topics, but occasionally, arguments on raising children or farming were not unheard of. My two tactiturn uncles were always silent, but my brave father would sometimes express opinions. The six sisters would unite against him and thoroughly humble him. In retaliation, he would bring out his violin and play old German songs strictly by ear. After that, he would sing "Rock of Ages" in a pleasant bass voice.

In afternoon, my two brothers and our boy cousins decided to go down to Lime Creek and go swimming. It was only one half mile away, so we were soon to the creek. We had never heard of swim suits at that time, much less owned one, but we quickly shed our clothes and were in the water. Most of the creek was only a couple feet deep, but there were occasional deep holes over our heads. The rest of the boys could all swim reasonably well, but I was the youngest and could not swim a stroke. I soon became bored and wandered along the bank trying to catch frogs.

I was beside a long stretch of shallow water, when to my total chagrin, I heard female voices. It was my two sisters and my female cousins out for a stroll along the creek!

I did not know what to do, but finally figured if I ran fast enough, I would be just a blur until I could safely reach the deep water. I leaped in at full spead, and, even though it was over my head, paddled and splashed furiously until I reached the other side of the deep water. My wife always wonders why I hate swimming, but when she reads this she will understand.

HONEYED PECAN SQUARES

1/2 Cup butter or margarine

3 tbsp Honey

1 1/2 tsp. Vanilla

1/4 tsp salt

1 cup unsifted flour

1 cup chopped pecans

1/3 cup sifted confectioners' sugar

In a bow using mixer at medium speed, beat together first 4 ingredients until light and fluff. About 3 minutes.

At low speed, blend in flour until dough forms. Blend in pecans.

Spread evenly in greased 8x8x2 baking pans. Bake in 325° for 35 minutes or until golden brown. Cool 5 minutes. Cut into 25 (1 1/2") squares. Cool completely in pan. Remove from the pan and roll squares in confectioners' sugar. Makes 25 bars.
