City Council Meeting Minutes August 19, 2008, 7:00 PM, City Hall

1.) Call to Order

The Fertile City Council met at 7:00 PM in regular session, August 19, 2008, at Fertile City Hall.

2.) Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell, Council Members: Jeff Berg, Tad Miller, Cindy Peters, Pat Renchin, Gail Shropshire, and City Clerk Eddie May. Absent were: City Manager Warren Bruns and Maintenance Worker Buck Russell.

- 3.) Minutes Approval
 - *Renchin motioned and Peters 2nd to approve the July 8 minutes.* Motion Carried.
 - Peters motioned and Miller 2nd to approve the July 15 minutes. Motion Carried.

4.) Winn-Worth Betco Representative Appointment

- Tad Miller was appointed as the primary representative. Mayor Russell was appointed as the alternate representative.
- Renchin motioned and Peters 2nd to approve the appointments.
 Motion Carried.

5.) NIMS Certification (National Incident Management System)

• Each Council Member, Mayor, City Maintenance Manager and City Clerk are required to become certified. Mayor Russell, Warren Bruns and Gail Shropshire are currently certified. May requested that as each person is certified, copies of their certification be kept at City Hall

6.) Mayor's Report

- Over 400 people were served at the Fertile Days dinner. The Fire Department ran out of eggs and bacon because of the great turn-out for breakfast the next morning! Thanks to everyone who helped out!!!!
- The current Fire Station is for sale. Check the sign for contact info.
- The new fire truck is fully registered, titled and insured.
- Mayor Russell has attended more than 7 FEMA meetings with the process still not complete.
- Yaggy-Colby has inspected the footbridge and park entrance bridge. The City expects a report from them within a couple of weeks.
- The City copier was repaired under warranty and is working again.
- 110 Housing Assistance Grant surveys were sent out, with 72 returned so far. We need 88 returned before the grant process can be continued.
- We will receive our grant award in Spring of 2009 with projects
- Eight residents have received notices to repair their buildings, remove rubbish and unlicensed vehicles. Residents have 3 months to respond.
- The City has a court date of September 10th to address a current resident's non-compliance.
- FEMA will be updating flood information for FEMA use. The core of engineers may be surveying Fertile over the next few months.

7.) City Clerk's Report

- May re-presented the 2008 year-end financials. Errors were corrected while filling out the DOT Street Finance Report.
- May presented the July financials.
- May presented the 2007-2008 DOT Street Finance Report (SFR).
- *Miller motioned and Shropshire 2nd to approve the DOT SFR.* Motion Carried.
- May presented the Outstanding Financial Obligations report stating current loan balances. The City owes \$130,000 for a \$300,000 sewer loan issued 4/78. The City owes \$120,665.98 for a \$263,300 water loan issued 3/80. The City owes \$16,986.78 for a \$35,000 water loan issued on 10/80. The City owes \$192,000 for a \$200,000.00 sewer

loan issued on 11/06. Altogether, the city currently owes \$ 439,032.7 for our water and sewer systems.

- May and Mayor Russell met with the City's Bank and received verbal confirmation for a two year note in the amount of \$55,000.00 at 6.75% APR for the new Fire Station building. The note will be secured by anticipated casino revenue.
- May presented the July expenditures. \$44,366.74 of the experiment of the experiment of the expension of the expenses.
- **Renchin motioned and Shropshire 2nd to approve the July** *Expenditures.* Motion Carried.

8.) City Maintenance Report

- Buck cut down the thistles at the lagoon.
- Kenny and Buck sprayed weeds at the ball park
- The new Maintenance position has been posted around town. The position will be posted on the Workforce Development website as we as published in the Forest City and Northwood papers.

9.) Other Business

 Dwight Harlan and Evelyn Elthon asked the Council about the state of the ditches on the north side of West Washington Street. Mayor Russell stated that FEMA is in the process of determining the best approach to repairing the water run-off issues before approving the project. The City expects to fix the ditches before winter.

German Potato Soup

- 1 1/2 cups of cubed Ham
- 4 slices of Bacon, fried crisp and crumbled
- 1 medium Onion, diced
- 2 stalks Celery diced
- 2 Tbsp Flour
- 1/4 cup Sugar
- 1/4 cup White Vinegar

1/4 cup Water

- 6-8 boiled Potatoes, cubed
- 1 cup shredded Carrots (for color)
- Salt & Pepper to taste.

4 cups Milk

1 cup shredded Cheddar Cheese (optional) Sauté' onion in bacon dripping. Stir together flour, sugar, vinegar, water, salt & pepper. Blend into pan with sautéed onions, Stir constantly to make a smooth sauce. Add potatoes, carrots, and bacon. Let simmer for hour if using a slow cooker. Serves 6
