

City Council Meeting Minutes April 20, 2010 7:00 PM, City Hall

Call to Order & Roll Call

Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Penny Miller, Tad Miller, Cindy Peters and Pat Renchin. Absent were City Clerk Eddie May, and Maintenance Manager Craig Koch.

Minutes Approval

- One edit on March minutes Under City Clerk Report it says that Tad 2nd approval of expenses but he was not at the meeting. Revise to say Pat 2nd.
- Penny motioned, Pat 2nd to approve the March minutes. Motion Carried.

Waste Management Contract

- Waste Management representatives presented a letter to the council asking for a rate increase and a new contract for five years with guaranteed cost of living increases of 3% per year plus built in fuel surcharges if fuel exceeds \$3 per gallon.
- Comparisons of other cities indicate there may be better deals available.
- WM stated that they could provide options, but it is up to the city to decide
 what they want to provide to the residents as far as the size of each
 dumpster and frequency of pick up.
- The city is required, by contract with the landfill, to dump at Lake Mills.
- The current contract with WM ends in June.
- WM will attend the May meeting with options for the city to consider.
- Jeff motioned, Pat 2nd to table the topic until the May meeting. Motion Carried.

Little League

- David Bang asked the city if the little league could install dugouts and some concrete to the East ball diamond to accommodate extra teams.
- League has enough money and volunteers that it will not cost city any money.
- Roughly 132 kids will be participating this year.
- Cindy motioned, Pat 2nd to allow improvements. Motion Carried.
- The City also needs to complete the improvements to the existing fence and poles, per insurance requirements.

Mayor's Report

- The city park flooded March 13th, due to rapid snow melt. The flood lasted through the 20th of March. No damage was done, but a lot of extra clean up is necessary. No FEMA claims were submitted.
- The city insurance through ICAP was paid in March. Total was \$10,837.61
 for the year. As we have been with them long enough to be vested, we get a
 discount of about \$900.
- A dog at large problem was reported at 504 West Washington. Apparently the resident has now moved out and taken the dog with.
- Joyce has been trained by the National Weather Service to be a storm spotter.
- The lagoon gates were damaged, apparently from a tractor driving into them. Repairs pending, but second gate is secure.
- Seven street lights have quit working. Alliant has been notified and fixed two of them so far. The rest will be fixed soon at no cost to the city.
- There will be sheriff sales on two properties June 8th. The owners owe the city for utilities, so liens will be put against the properties prior to the sale. The properties are located at 105 N Hill Street and 504 West Washington.
- New trees will be planted by the ball fields on Earth Day April 22, at 2:00 PM. Everyone is invited to attend. Media will be present.
- WCDA awards were granted March 15th. Fertile received a total of \$86,818.90 for completing blacktop work on the city streets. The WCDA is the non-profit arm of the Diamond Joe Casino.

City Clerk's Report

- Eddie was absent but presented a version of the March financials with footnotes.
- The following statistics report the % of budgeted revenue received year-to-date as well as the % of budgeted expenses spent year-to-date (75% of year).

• The City currently has a \$54,618.40 Net Loss for the fiscal year. This deficit is the result of the road surfacing done in July, 2009, the \$30,000 purchase of Hall's Apartments and \$3,500 cost to remove asbestos, as part of the Community Center Project. The \$33,500 will be reimbursed to the City from the WCDA grant awarded last fall before the end of the fiscal year. The deficit caused by the roads project will be taken out of savings for that particular project.

- There was a question relating to a \$1297.60 check written to the Library. This amount
 was automatically deposited into the City's account last month and recorded as income
 for the City. The amount, however, was supposed to be deposited in the Library's
 account. The check this month offsets the incorrect deposit from last month.
- Tad motioned, Cindy 2nd to approve the March Expenses. Motion Carried.
- Pat motioned, Cindy 2nd to apply a lien to 105 N Hill Street for utilities in the amount
 of \$276.60. Roll Call Vote was Unanimous. Motion Carried.
- Penny motioned, Tad 2nd to apply a lien to 501 West Washington for utilities in the amount of \$276.60. Roll Call Vote was Unanimous. Motion Carried.
- Penny motioned, Cindy 2nd to apply a lien to 504 West Washington for utilities in the amount of \$212.88. Roll Call Vote was Unanimous. Motion Carried.
- Jeff motioned, Pat 2nd to take legal action against the resident at 308 West Main for utilities in the amount of \$223.33. Roll Call Vote was Unanimous. Motion Carried.

Maintenance Report

- Craig has been fixing pot holes on the main roads. He will begin fixing pot holes in the alley ways this week.
- Lagoon will need to have a tree removed from the berm on the west side and will need to control smaller willows coming up there that are holding water.

Committee Reports

- Fertile Days: The WCDA will decide on donations for city celebrations in early May. With Money from the former FB&I committee, and current donations, we have around \$800 for this year's celebration. Our next meeting is planned for May 10th. Everyone is invited to attend.
- Garden Club: The Garden Club purchased flowers, pots and supplies to start placing decorative items throughout the city.


Upcoming Meetings



MEET ME AT BASHA'S

In our previous chapter, Muffy, Angel, Harriet and George had left Iowa to vacation in the south west. Our story ended with George buying a mobile home and lot for their son and getting settled in their own mobile home.

JUST A FEW STEPS FROM PARADISE

Our lot in Lake Pleasant Estates on the corner of 107th and Union Hills Drive is one mile from CIRCEL K and 1/2 mile from Basha's. It is also a short distance from a RV and Park Model park name Paradise. On my morning walks, I found that even though they had a guard at the gate, you could walk in with no challenge. They had a coffee club in a large hall where every morning 20 to 40 people would gather for coffee and conversation. My first time in joining in I pretended that I lived there, but the guard at the gate told me they really did not care and actually welcomed my 25 cent contribution to the coffee kitty. After tht for several weeks I was a regular and also used their exercise room since no one seemed to mind. My friend Gus, whom I met on my walk daily, always inquired how it felt to have one foot in Paradise. This made me feel a bit guilty so I went into their office and asked if I could pay a fee to use their exercise room. I got a very emphatic NO and that is how I became a regular at Fitness I. We still go to Paradise for their monthly craft show and occasionally I drop in for morning coffee. Many, many people from Iowa and Minnesota live there in winter and Canadians, Alaskans and every other state. One couple even knew my cousin Juane from Nora Springts, IA.

Fitness l is a very large fitness center with every piece of equipment ever made. There is a very reasonable fee of \$19 per month and they are constantly running specials for even less. I became totally addicted to morning workouts. Harriet does not get up until 9:00 ro 9:30 a.m. so I usually rise and 5:30 a.m. and have my workout done by the time she is ready for breakfast. The ages of regulars of Fitness 1 range from 18 to 80. Their occupations are schoolteachers, bankers, small contractors and of course many retired people. Everyone has a story to tell and I am delighted to listen. If you ask what to get your wife for a valentine, you get a multitude of suggestions. Dinner and a movie, full body massages, flowers and jewelry. Our Honda salesman instantly asked whether it was my wife or girl friend that I was shopping for. When I mentioned to him that I had not been to a movie theatre in almost 40 years he made this comment. "You know they have talkies now and even color". I figure since no one is buying cars, he and his fellow salesmen and illegal. Then I point out that the best part of Phoenix was built with Mexican labor. There are beautiful block walls everywhere along with immaculate yards with shrubs and flowers. It is a great pleasure just to drive around sightseeing. Sheriff Joe recently rounded up 60 of them as a publicity stunt and some of them even did the landscaping on the county jail.! Almost everyone out here loves Joe and his racial profiling but I tell them they simply cannot afford him. He has hundreds of lawsuits filed against him and of course Maricopa County has to pay his bills. Some of the jobless contractors almost threaten physical violence when I express my opinions. When I tell them I would rather jerk every tooth in my mouth out with a pair of rusty pliers instead of going to an American dentist, they suggest I move to Mexico and stay there. I say I do not wish to live there, I just want my teeth fixed in a reasonable time at a resonable price. These guys have barrel size arm muscles. They regularly run up and down stairs with a 50-pound weight on either arm. They routinely lift weights for many repititions, which I cannot even get off the floor. I soon settle into a routine of two hours exercise, then coffee and a newspaper on the way home and then breakfast and lunch later on with Harriet.

MEETINGS AT BASHA'S.

In the afternoons I would walk the 1 1/2 miles to Basha's for casual conversation. There are easy chairs and three tables with 4 chars each set up by the coffee counter and then several tables and chairs set up on an outdoor patio. The same people would usually wander in every afternoon for coffee and conversation. One of my favorite people was Larry, a retired tour bus driver. He had suffered a stroke but was very fluent. He loves jokes and starts laughing so hard before finishing, he cannot complete them. Surprising enough almost everyone in the group had suffered a stroke. Then there is Don who has a definite speech impediment. There are so many words that he finds it impossible to say that is is almost like charades for us to try to get the right words for him. He carries a card explaining his handicap but his courage is amazing and he constantly is teasing everyone. He says his wife calls him Maytag since he is always agitating! Again he cannot get the word "agitator" out, so it is ag-ag-ag ag until someone comes to his rescue. He will never attempt "Swarzenegger" or "Psychotic" but must search for ways to get around them. His courage is that he joins in almost daily. I always tell him I would be hiding in my basement with a handicap like his, but he just grins and brings forth another witticism".

BETTY

Betty is a retired schoolteacher from Oscaloosa, IA and by far the most respectable one of our group with the exception of my wife Harriet. She is always impecably dressed in slacks and pretty tops. She and Judge John are constantly bickering, as when he finds something to annoy her, he never quits. She is a very strong Democrat so he constantly uses the "N" word to infuriate her. She says if she could get her hands around his neck that would be his demise. She is a widow with a house in Sun City, but still has strong Iowa ties even though she and her deceased husband have lived here for many years.

JUDGE JOHN

Judge John is a retired judge with a physical handicap that makes him use one of Basha's electric carts almost exclusively. He is not a good driver and crashes into chairs daily when he joins our group. One day he hit a lady from Canada in the heel and I thought there might be a lawsuit. When he found the carts squeak or beep in reverse, he constantly moves back and forth to annoy Betty. He weighs 317 pounds and his hands shake and some days he does not look good at all. He is from Chicago and has very strong opinions about politics and everything else. Betty has grilled him repeatedly as to what kind of judge he was but always gets a different answer. One of his best stories is driving along a street in Chicago. There was a group of Afro-Americans standing on a corner with a rain puddle in front of them so he ran through it and drenched the whole group. Then his car drowned out and he was at their mercy!

DARREL:

Darrell is the one member of our motley crew who is still working. He has a daily doughnut route that takes about 3 - 4 hours per day. He is from Knoxville, IA, growing up on a farm there. He is younger and better preserved though he, too, has had many health problems in the past. He has been married three times which facinates everyone. He had a career as an executive in a bank and has had many other jobs in management. Our bunch never lacks for conversation when he is present and has some excellent ideas on solving our economic problems in the United Sttes.

THIS DID NOT TAKE PACE AT Basha's but is maybe of interest. One morning I needed my billfold to pay my monthly dues at the fitness center so brought my billfold up to the desk. After paying the bill they offered to keep my billfold so I would not have to go all the way back to the locker room. Then they asked where I kept my car keys and I said, "in the car ignition, where else?" They were horrified and said, "You cannot do that, your car will be stolen!" Of course I told them that in Iowa we not only leave the keys in the car but also rarely lock the house when we leave. Of course their comment was "This is not Iowa." That triggered a group arguemnt, with me promoting the idea that everyone should be considered trustworthy. Finally I felt I was losing the scrap so I said, "Well if Jesus was driving, he would leave the keys in his car!" This was kicked around for a time with no clear advantage. Finally an elderly Afro-American sitting there said in a dignified voice, "Jesus would be walking."

HANK AND RENEE

Hank and Renee were frequent afternoon visitors at Bashas. They were from the midwest and had lived in Paradise for 22 years. Renee is very outgoing and knows practically everyone in Paradise. Even though Democrats are far in the minority in Arizona, Hank is not a bit afraid to express himself. They have a fine grapefruit tree on their lot and it bore profusely. Though they had little use for the surplus, Hank still put a sign saying. "No Republicans need ask for grapefruit!"

ROSIE AND BILLY

Rosie and Billy are really not part of Basha's but worthy of honorable mention. We met them at the Salvation Army breakfast which we attend Mondays and Thursdays. Rosie has a three acre horse ranch about 2 miles from our mobile home park. She cares for Billy, who is totally blind, 27 horses and 5 dogs. She also gives riding lessons and owns a racehorse. She told us when the horse named Continental was running at the local racetract, so of course Harriet and I made it a point to attend and cheer him on. We have never attended a horse race before so it was extremely interesting if not profitble. We put two dollars on him to win but unfortunately he finished fifth. Rosie said it was the jockey's fault, he should have increased his speed earlier. She says he is sure to do better when she runs him again in March. Rosie's horses are extremely well fed and cared for. She has several thousand bales of hay sitting there, which she saves for all year. She has owned her ranch since 1971 so she certainly knows what she is doing.

THE UPS GUY

The UPS guy is a fitness 1 person and not Basha's. He is about 35 and does a very physical workout. He is totally dressed in brown, even down to his socks. He says his fellow UPS guys have girl friends scattred all along their routes. Apparently that works fine until they dump them and they invariably call UPS headquarters and report their ex-boyfriends sexual misconduct. He says he never goes down that road because his Sicilian wife would kill him.





4 eggs 2 cups sugar 1/2 cup flour 1 1/2 tsp. Salt

4 cups rhubarb, finely chopped

Combine flour, powdered sugar and butter. Mix well and press into greased 9x13 pan. Bake at 350° until golden brown, 10 to 15 minutes.

Beat eggs, sugar, flour and salt until well blended. Add rhubarb; mix. Spoon mixture onto baked crust. Bake at 350° for 45 minutes or more. Cool and cut into bars.


