

# City Council Meeting Minutes November 14, 2011 - 7:00 PM, City Hall

#### Call to Order & Roll Call

- Present were: Mayor Joyce Russell; Council Members: Jeff Berg, Penny Miller, and Tad Miller; Maintenance Manager: Steve Roberts & City Clerk Eddie May. Absent were Council Members: Cindy Peters & Pat Renchin.
- Penny motioned, Tad 2nd to approve the Oct. Minutes. Carried.

#### City Maintenance Report

- Steve and Buck got really wet helping Larsen's put in a new water well pump meter.
- Warren and Steve toured the lagoons and Steve has been putting in additional rock to shore up the erosion and muskrat holes.
- Steve has been working on a measuring tool to monitor the depth of the sewer lagoons.
- Steve has been fixing the vandalized picnic tables.
- Josh Miller has helped Steve get the snow plow all ready for winter.
- Steve will be fixing a few more pot-holes before the snow flys.

#### Mayor's Report

- On 10/19, Joyce attended a meeting in Hanlontown with Senator Tom Harkin's assistant Dan Smith, area Mayors, and County Supervisors in regards to Federal and State funding for roads, housing and water/sewer project. Joyce brought up the paving of Main Street which is a Town to Market road, painting of water towers, and streamlining the CDBG process.
- On 10/25 more vandalism occurred in the park.
- Mayor Russell was misinformed in regards to the properties at 210
  West Main and 501 West Washington. To correct September's
  minutes, Schoneman Realty is not the owner of the properties. The
  legitimate owners have been notified, and have cleaned up the
  properties as requested. A BIG THANK YOU to Schoneman Realty
  for helping us clear up the misunderstanding.
- The Worth County and Winnebago County Sherriff's offices have been monitoring a black stretch vehicle and white cargo van who have attempted to abduct children on the school bus routes. If you have any information, please contact the Worth County Sherriff's office at: 800-458-1234.
- On 11/8, a City election was held at City Hall. Mayor Joyce Russell and Council Member Jeff Berg were re-elected. Council Member Cindy Peters lost to Julie Jessen. Julie starts the new position in January. Cindy has been a part of several committees including Parks, Weeds & Garbage, Community Center, Housing and Fertile Days. Cindy has been a great asset to the community. We will miss her on the Council and hope she still stays involved.





Bud was a member of Grace Lutheran Church in Hanlontown and the Pioneer Golf and Country in Manly, Edward Tosel American Legion Post #110 in Manly, Hanlontown Volunteer Fire Department and the Hanlontown Community Club.

#### 4-H Clubs

The Livewire Lassies 4-H Club was started when 20 girls met at the home of Mrs. Robert (Ora) Kuhn, the first leader in November 1951. Some years later the name was changed to Grant Livewire Lassies. This club now in the 25th year has 26 members from in and around Fertile, Many awards, blue ribbons and trips have been won over the years. Many mothers have been leaders or helped with promoting this club.

The local 4-H Clubs have taken part in many service projects. Each year in June the girls sponsor a childrens Costume and Pet Parade on Main Street. Pets, large and small, bicycles and costumes appear along with smiling faces. Prizes are given, pictures taken and treats are

given to all participants.

Mrs. Don (Betty) Waddington, one of the first members in 1951 is now the leader along with Mrs. Duane

(Marcheta) Pederson this year.

The Fertile Valley Farmers 4-H Club was organized in 1969 by leaders Arvid Holton and Stanley Zirbel. These were the charter members: Bruce Holton, Gary Calgaard, Bradley Suby, Ken Hauge, Darrell Haugen and Billy Sellers.

In addition to the usual 4-H projects members have

participated in local and state wide tours.

Each year the club holds a family night with pot luck supper and awards are given to deserving members.

Bruce Holton, long time member constructed a Model T Ford from separate parts of some 20 cars plus some new parts. He was an Iowa candidate for the National Petroleum Power Award given by a large petroleum company in Chicago.

The club now has 36 members.

#### Fertile Garden Club

The Fertile Garden Club was organized in 1953 when 6 ladies who belonged to the Clear Lake Garden Club decided to have a club in Fertile. These ladies were Della Haugen, Violet Hall, Hilda Johnson, the late Gunhild Myhre Arlene Stevens and Ruthie Ouverson. They met at the Myhre home to organize. There a constitution was made up and membership was not to exceed 25 members. The pink petunia was chosen as the club flower. Each lady asked 3 others to join at the first regular meeting at the home of Della Haugen. #### OVERNIGHT SAUSAGE SOUFFLE

1/4 teaspoon salt






